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- No reliable data on young driver licensing
 - Current proportion licensed?
 - by age?
 - by state?
 - Historical trends?
 - in relation to GDL?
 - other factors?



 Perception that young people are delaying getting their license

- Why?
 - GDL makes it difficult?
 - GDL makes it undesirable?
 - Facebook etc. = no need to drive?
 - High cost, tough economy, etc?



Objective of this Study

- Determine proportion licensed
 - Within 6 months of state's minimum age
 - Within 12 months of minimum age
 - Before vs. after 18th birthday

- Investigate reasons for delay
 - Demographic factors
 (sex, household income, race/ethnicity, urban/rural, strength of GDL, licensing age)
 - Self-reported reasons

- Nationally-representative survey
 - Ages 18-20
 - Research panel recruited via probability-based sampling (telephone and mail)
 - Questionnaires administered online
 - Computer, internet provided if needed
 - English & Spanish
 - Weighted to reflect US population
 - -N=1,051



Questionnaire covered:

- Current license status

Age at licensure, permit

Reasons for delay

19 items: Very important reason
 Somewhat important reason

Minor reason Not a reason



Licensure Status at Time of Survey

71% licensed

13% learner permit

• 16% no license, no permit



- 29% licensed within 6 months of minimum age
- 44% licensed within 12 months of minimum age

- 54% licensed before 18th birthday
- 72% permit before 18th birthday



Factors Associated with Not Getting License Before 18th Birthday

Household Income

< \$35K/year: 68% **not** licensed before 18

\$35-75K/year: 49%

> \$75K/year: 27%

Race/ethnicity

Non-Hispanic white: 33%

African American/Hispanic: 69%

Sex, urban/rural, GDL strength, state licensing age: not significant



Self-Reported Reasons for Delay (Among Those Not Licensed by 18)

(% "Very Important" or "Somewhat Important")

- 45% No car
- 40% Could get around without driving
- 36% Too expensive
- 31% Nervous about driving
- 29% Just not interested
- 28% Had to complete driver ed first
- 26% Parents too busy
- 21% Respondent too busy
- 17% Could connect with friends online



Delaying Licensure for the Purpose of Avoiding GDL?

 24% - special requirements for young drivers made it hard to get a license

 21% - didn't want a license with special restrictions for young drivers

 19% - to avoid having to take driver ed



Delaying Licensure for the Purpose of Avoiding GDL?

Of respondents not licensed by 18th birthday:

- 71% still not licensed by 19th birthday
- 55% still not licensed by 20th birthday



- Self-reported data
 - Might not have remembered when they got licensed
 - Might not really know why they delayed
- National survey
 - 3 states account for 27% of all responses
 - 8 states account for 50% of all responses
 - Not much variation in GDL



Most don't get licensed right away

- Only 44% licensed within 12 months of minimum age, 54% licensed before 18
- Most cite cost, lack of opportunity, lack of interest;
 few cite difficulty of GDL or desire to avoid GDL
- Majority of those not licensed by 18 still not licensed by 19, many not even licensed by 20





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
